The fundraising campaign for much-needed updates to Renfrew Victoria Hospital's emergency department received a \$15,000 boost from Ontario Power Generation (OPG).

This recent donation added to previous support moves OPG into the RVH Foundation's naming convention. A room in the emergency department will be named for OPG in the new year to acknowledge the longstanding support.
